DIED.

SERVERA At Beaver City March 9th. 1891. Allonso M. Skinner, aged 36 years. Deceased was born at San Bernardino, Cal., July 11th 1854. Emigrated to Utah with his parents in 1858, arriving in Beaver city on Feb. 5th of same year, where he continously resided (except for 3 years that he lived in the town of Central in Sevier county) until his death. The decease I has been a great sufferer for many years, but bore it all with the utmost resignation. He was a faithful member of the church of Jesus Christ of Lieter day Saints and died in full faith of a glorious resurrection.

-At eight o'clock Monday morning Alphonze Skinner, a well known young man of this city died. Deceased had for a long time been a sufferer from heartdisease and dropsy, his sickness being of such a severe character as to ren ler him for many months past a e implete invalid. While he would at times have apparently frequent changes for the better, yet the insiduous nature of his malady rendered his ultimate recovery an uncertain matter. Latterly the prevailing epidemic seems to have aggravated his complaint to such an extent as to bring about his demise as above stated.
