

Plan Home-Coming and Black Hawk Celebration, 1935

A big Black-Hawk Encampment and Home Coming celebration in Nephi in August 1935, is the plan now being formulated by some of Nephi's citizens. The plan as suggested is to organize a local unit of the Sons and Daughters of the Utah Indian War veterans and ask that next year's encampment be held here, and in addition to organize a local committee to work out plans for the big home-coming celebration.

There are many hundreds of former Nephites now living in various parts of the United States who would come to Nephi for a large celebration, and it is pointed out that a year's time is needed to properly advertise a big home-coming celebration.

The annual Indian War Veterans encampment is being held at Springville next month and it is planned to send a strong delegation to that city and secure the encampment for Nephi for next year.

There is one thing certain—that Nephi is an ideal location for a big celebration, and has at its command one of the finest fair grounds in the state, which could be secured for such a celebration.

As was portrayed at Tuesday's celebration the people of Nephi have the proper attitude toward staging a celebration, and all that is necessary is the proper leadership and the right amount of boasting and a little less knocking, and we can put over the biggest celebration ever held in Central Utah.
