

Dates Set For Annual Celebration at Nephi

Business Men, Committee Members Pledge To Make 1936 Ute Stampede and Band Contests Bigger Observance Than Ever Before Held in This Community

The second annual Ute Stampede will be held on Thursday, Friday and Saturday, July 9, 10 and 11, with an enlarged program of rodeo, races and and entertainment. This year's entertainment will be augmented by a state-wide municipal band contest being staged at the same time as the annual Stampede.

Dr. P. L. Jones was the unanimous choice for chairman of the big annual celebration, and this choice for chairman was made after careful consideration of all the men available for the position. Dr. Jones acted as chairman for the annual Blackhawk encampment held here last year, which proved to be the largest celebration ever held in this section of the state and without doubt the most successful Blackhawk encampment ever held in Utah.

The Committee voted to engage the famous Colborn Sorenson rodeo company to furnish livestock and also to direct the arena for the show. Word has already been received from Colborn and Sorenson that a number of the world's best rodeo performers will be in Utah during the month of July and will attend the Nephi celebration, providing it was held between the 4th and 24th of July.

The Juab county fair grounds will be used again this year for the big celebration, and in addition to the grandstands and bleachers already constructed, it is the plan of the committee to build additional seats for the large number of people who will be in Nephi for this large stampede.

Mayor Receives Assurance Of a C. C. C. Camp

Assurance that a C C C camp will be established in the Mount Nebo territory for the coming summer for the purpose of doing flood control work on the Marsh canyon section, has been given the officials of Nephi City in a letter from the office of R. H. Rutledge, forest supervisor in charge of the entire district. The camp establishment here has been approved by Mr. Fechner, director of C C C camps for the United States.

The flood control work is needed immediately on the section, to protect the springs, pipeline and headhouse of the Nephi City waterworks from destructive floods which come from the Marsh flats above the springs.

According to the forest service officials, approximately \$50,000.00 worth of work will be done on the territory in flood and erosion control.

Ben Beveridge, director of W. P. A. work for this district, stated that if a C C C camp is established in this territory, it would be folly for the city to continue their flood control work in the Marsh canyon area, and that the money appropriated for this work should be
