

'UTE STAMPEDE' TO BE HELD HERE AGAIN THIS YEAR

Temporary Committee Is Appointed To Make The Preliminary Plans

The Ute Stampede will be held in Nephi during the coming summer, according to the unanimous opinion of the assembled civic and church leaders at a public meeting Monday night, called by Mayor Wilford Bailey for the discussion of the possibilities for the holding of the second annual event. The date for the entertainment has not been set.

The first Ute Stampede was held in connection with the Blackhawk encampment last August, and was one of the most successful celebrations put over in the State of Utah during the 1935 season.

A temporary committee, to take charge of preliminary arrangement was named at the meeting Monday night. It is headed by Dr. P. L. Jones, who successfully conducted the affairs of the 1935 celebration, and includes Gilbert Bailey, June Kendall, Herman McCune, Loran Park and Mayor Bailey. This committee was instructed to contact rodeo and concession companies relative to furnishing entertainment for the stampede.

The Juab County fair grounds, located at Nephi, is well equipped to handle a major rodeo, such as the Colborn - Sorenson Madison Square Garden Rodeo company staged here last year. It was stated at the meeting that the committee make a bid for the services of this great company again this year, inasmuch as their stock and corps of riders are included in the foremost in the United States.

The fair grounds also boasts a fine track for races. To duplicate last year's races, horses from all over the intermountain country would necessarily have to enter the 1936 events.

Because of the central location of Nephi, with good roads leading from all surrounding sections and counties, the annual celebration should take its place among the foremost annual event in the state.
